COLLEGE PROFILE

Established in the year 1976 under the initiative of a Governing body and later, taken over by the Government in the year 1979, Lilong Haoreibi College remains flourished under its uniqueness of being the only higher educational institute which is located at the educationally, economically and socially backward minority Muslim concentrated area in Manipur. The institute spreads over 16.78 acres of a beautiful landscape at Lilong Usoipokpi, Thoubal District, Manipur alongside the Indo-Myanmar highway at a distance of 15 kilometres from Imphal, the capital city of Manipur. The College has been recognized under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the University Grants Commission Act 1956.

The co-educational institute offers 14 undergraduate programmes in B.A. and B.Sc. with 62 teaching faculties. The College has also been approved under the University Grants Commission for conducting skill based job oriented B. Voc. Degree Programme in Agriculture from the academic session of 2020-21. The College shall also begin add-on Programmes in Mushroom Cultivation and ICT from this academic session.

With an annual average enrolment of about 2,000 plus students predominantly belonging to the socioeconomically and educationally backward minority Muslim community, the College has the pride of having produced many toppers in the examinations conducted by the Manipur University.

The College has recently been accredited by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) for the 1st cycle with grade 'B' (2.39 CGPA). It is, especially in the last couple of years, has been in constant effort towards becoming at par with other premier institutes in the region. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College has also been giving its full devotion to ensure overall quality improvement of the College.

In line with the NEP 2020 recommendations, the College is also preparing to introduce the 4-year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) under the National Council for Teachers Education (NCTE), further enhancing its academic offerings. This initiative will offer BA. B.Ed. and BSc. B.Ed. programs.

Library Automation (semi) with the installation of KOHA software, subscription of N-LIST INFLIBNET facility, connection of BSNL Leased Line Internet facility with Wi-Fi enabled campus, smart classrooms and ICT facilities are some of the remarkable efforts apart from others taken up by the College in the recent past with the sole devotion towards realizing its vision.



Admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Voc. 1st Semester Programmes shall be opened to students who have passed higher secondary examination or equivalent examinations of Council of Higher Secondary Education, Manipur or other Board / University recognized by Manipur University. INTAKE CAPACITY & ELIGIBILITY

Mode of Admission

- 1. The duly filled in prescribed Application Form along with relevant documents should be submitted to the Admission Committee of the college during the stipulated time for form submission.
- 2. Selection of eligible candidates for admission shall be done purely on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 Examinations.
- 3. Reservation of seats and relaxation of marks for applicants belonging to the SC/ ST/ OBC/PH/Other reserved categories shall be as per the rules of the State Government.
- 4. College will set up Help Desks for counselling students to assist in the admission process.
- 5. Admission fees should be paid at the Manipur Rural Bank, Lilong through the Bank Challan issued by the Admission Committee of the college during the specified time for admission and **Fee paid MRB Challan** should be shown to the Counters opened for admission at the Administrative Block of the college.

Registration

Every student enrolled in B.A./B.Sc./B.Voc. 1st Semester Programmes under the Manipur University shall register himself/herself with the University by applying in the prescribed application form along with necessary fee as prescribed by the University from time to time. The University shall issue registration certificate to all students registered with the University

Transfer

Transfer of students from one College to another under Manipur University is allowed with prior permission of the College Principal subject to approval of the University.

PROGRAMME DETAILS

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A. Core Course: This is a course which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete the requirement of a programme in a said discipline/subject of study. Each of the Core Courses shall contain two components: Theory and Practical/Tutorial. Theory Paper having Practical shall carry 4 Credits so that Practical carries 2 Credits. Theory Paper having Tutorial shall carry 5 Credits so that Tutorial carries 1 Credit.

B. Elective Course: Generally, an elective course is a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill.

An elective course may be three types:

(a) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course : Elective courses offered by the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective Courses. This course is to advance knowledge and skill in the core domain. Each of the DSE courses shall contain two componenets: Theory and Practical/Tutorial. Theory Paper having Practical carries 2 Credits so that Tutorial carries 1 Credit.

(b) Dissertation/Project/Internship: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge is termed as dissertation/project. This is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in Dissertation/Project Work/Internship is optional and it may be offered in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper in 8th September.

(c) Generic Elective Course (GSC) : An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek a wide exposure is called a Generic Elective. A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective. Each of the GEC Courses shall contain two components: Theory and Practical/Tutorial. Theory Paper having Practical shall carry 4 Credits so that Practical carries 2 Credits. Theory Paper having Tutorial shall carry 5 Credits so that Tutorial carries 1 Credits.

C. Ability Enhancement Course: The Ability Enhancement Course may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement: (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. These may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide valuebased and/or skill-based knowledge. Each of the AECC and SEC courses shall carry 4 Credits.

D. Value Addition Courses (VAC): These are courses that will help develop all capacities of human beings - intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner. It includes subjects like Yoga, Sports Health Care, NCC, NSS, Ethics, Culture etc, VAC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses. Each VAC course shall carry 2 Credits.

Bachelor's Certificate

The Bachelor's Certificate in a discipline is obtainable after 1 year (two semesters) of study. A Bachelor's Certificate in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 4 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and minimum 3 Value Addition Courses (VAC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 46 Credits.

Bachelor's Diploma

The Bachelor's Diploma in a discipline is obtainable after 2 years (four semesters) of study. A Bachelor's Diploma in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 10 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), minimum 4 Value Addition Courses (VAC) and 2 Generic Elective Courses (GEC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 96 Credits.

Bachelor's Degree

The Bachelor's Degree in a discipline is obtainable after 3 years (six semesters) of study. A Bachelor's degree (i.e., B.Sc./B.A./B.Com.) in a discipline degree may be awarded if a student studies 14 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), minimum 5 Value Addition Courses (VAC), 2 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses and minimum 3 Generic Elective (GE) courses, with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 140 Credits.

Bachelor's Degree with Honours

The Bachelor's Degree with Honours in a discipline is obtainable after 4 years (eight semesters) of study. A Bachelor's degree with Honours (i.e., B.Sc. (Honours)/B.A. (Honours)/B.Com. (Honours)) in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 18 core papers in that discipline, 1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), minimum 5 Value Addition Courses (VAC), 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), minimum 5 Value Addition Courses (DSE) and minimum 4 Generic Elective Courses (GEC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 182 Credits.

Mechanism for Computation of Work-load:

The following mechanism shall be adopted for computation of work-load:

- (a) 1 Credit 1 Theory period of one hour duration / week / semester;
- (b) 1 Credit 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration / week / semester;
- (c) 1 Credit 1 Practical period of two hours duration / week / semester;
- (d) 1 Credit Internship of 1 week / semester.

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B.VOC. PROGRAMME IN AGRICULTURE*

With an objective to cater to students who are enthusiastic in agricultural sector for job and livelihood prospects, the College runs B.Voc. Programme in Agriculture with a maximum intake capacity of 50. The syllabus and curriculum of the programme are aligned with the National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) in the judicious mixture of 40 percent general education component and 60 percent skill development component. The semester wise examinations of the general education component are conducted by the affiliating University as is done in the traditional degree courses whereas the skill component is assessed and certified under the Agriculture Sector Skill Council of India, New Delhi. The total weightage of the examinations and assessments at all exits or the semesters are carried forward to the cumulative credit points required for the award of the B.Voc. Degree, which is treated at par with any other bachelor's degrees such as B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., etc.

ADD-ON PROGRAMMES*

With an aim at providing technical know-how of mushroom cultivation and entrepreneurship development among interested students of the College, an add-on programme on mushroom cultivation has been introduced from this academic session as an initiative of the Vocational Unit of the College. The course plan of the programme has been designed to meet the theoretical and practical knowledge of mushroom farming and enable the learner to start small scale and cost-effective mushroom cultivation.

The College shall strictly adhere to the rules set by Manipur University in respect of the scheme and system of examinations.

ATTENDANCE AND DISCIPLINE

- (a) Every student should have at least 75% attendance in each semester to be eligible for appearing in the semester examination.
- (b) Students should maintain a high standard of discipline in the College. They have to follow the rules and regulations of the College.
- (c) College properties such as furniture, library books, toilets, lab equipments etc. should be treated with due care.
- (d) Smoking, drinking, abuse of drugs and other intoxicants, etc. in and around the College campus are strictly prohibited.
- (e) Students are to refrain from gossiping, making noise and loitering around the College verandah/corridor to create a peaceful academic atmosphere in the College,.
- (f) Students, both boys and girls, are required to follow a "*Uniform Dress Code*" prescribed by the College authority as listed hereunder:

Boys: Black Formal Trousers, Black Belt, White Shirt-Full/Half, Black Shoes, White Socks, Black Sweater/Blazer

Girls: Grey Phanek, White Shirt-Full/Half, Black Shoes, White Socks, Black Sweater/Blazer, Black Head Scarf (for Muslim Girls)

- (g) Students violating rules and regulations of the College are liable to be penalized.
- (h) Every student of Lilong Haoreibi College must carry in person a valid identity card issued by the College.

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC)

As per National Education Policy 2020, the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) has been envisaged to facilitate the academic mobility of students with the freedom to study across the Higher Education Institutions in the country with an appropriate "credit transfer" mechanism from one programme to another, leading to attain a Degree/ Diploma/PG-diploma, etc. ABC shall deposit credits awarded by registered institutions into students' accounts. The Academic bank credit(s) can only be shared from institutions, not directly from the student. Only credits submitted by an authorized institution will be accepted for storage and validation by the ABC.

APAAR, which stands for Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry, is a specialized identification system designed for all students in India. This initiative is part of the 'One Nation, One Student ID' program launched by the Union government, aligning with the new National Education Policy of 2020. Every student admitted in the College is required to register for APAAR/ABC ID - a unique 12-digit code through <u>https://www.abc.gov.in/</u> to digitally store, manage, and access all their academic credits, including degrees, diplomas, certificates, training details, and co-curricular accomplishments. This ID functions as a digital identity for the student in the realm of education.



FACILITIES AND STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Library

The College has a large central library with more than 20,000 books. A photocopying machine of the College has already been installed in the administrative block along with fax and internet facilities. Students and teachers can enjoy this facility at concessional rate. The library is open to bonafide students of the College. Students, teachers and other staff members of the College are entitled to become members of the library.

Canteen

The College has a canteen providing tea, coffee, snacks, etc. to students and staff at reasonable price.

Hostel

Spreading over vast area surrounded by green cover, the Lilong Haoreibi College has opened separate boys and girls hostels starting from the academic session 2019-20. These hostels, constructed by the MOBEDS, provide accommodation to many students coming from far flung corners of the state. Students can apply for hostel accommodation only after admission.

College Activities

Lilong Haoreibi College is proud of having an excellent playground which can be exploited to the best advantage by sports persons. The College organizes Inter-House Annual Sports Meet and Cultural& Literary Meet to explore the talents of the students.

National Service Scheme (NSS)**

To engage students in creative and constructive activities, to gain skill, personality, and leadership, three units of National service Scheme (NSS) have been opened with an involvement of 100 student volunteers in each unit. Normally, enrolment to this scheme is done with the commencement of a new academic session. Students who desire to join this scheme are advised to approach the NSS programme officers (POs).

National Cadet Corps (NCC)**

The College has well disciplined contingents of NCC Army Wings provided by the 14(M)Bn. under the charge of Dr. L. Dorendro Singh, Assistant Professor, Mathematics Department to facilitate the active participation of the students in the social programmes like blood donation, community service, disaster management, Traffic Awareness etc and also to groom them into disciplined and patriotic citizens. Any student of the College may join NCC subject to physical fitness.

** Weightage of 2 marks in overall index is given to those students who have participated in NSS Camps/passed NCC (C Certificate) Course while applying for admission to PG courses in the Manipur University.

Excursion/study tours

External /Internal study tours for certain subjects are compulsory for every student enrolled in the concerned degree course as prescribed by the University from time to time as a part of the course.

Co-curricular activities

Under experienced guides, to build up personalities and instill leadership qualities to students of this College, the College organizes co-curricular activities/programmes such as Debating competition, Ex-tempore speech Competition, One act play, Public speaking, Quiz contest, etc.
